### *EUROCLIO 18th Annual Conference in Poland*

**More than 40 participants from 15 countries in Europe** convened to the historical surroundings of the [Krzyzowa Foundation for Mutual Understanding in Europe](#) for the **18th EUROCLIO Annual Conference** focused on the theme “*Cross Border History: Onsite Learning at the Heart of Europe*”. The Conference comprised of high quality lectures on the recently established bilateral Committee for



Polish-German educational cooperation and learning of history and the Image of Tatars in the German History Textbooks by **Ulrich Bongertmann**, Member of the Committee and VGD, the German History Teachers Association and **Marat Gibatdinov**, President of the History Teachers Association of Tatarstan respectively. Participants were engaged in an active roundtable discussion sharing their views on best practice examples on cross border cooperation. **Joke van der Leeuw-Roord**, EUROCLIO Executive Director, opened the discussion presenting

the inspirational role of EUROCLIO in promoting cross border education giving afterwards the floor to **Hanneke Verbeek** from the Leiden University, who presented the Research Project "[Spoorzoekers-Vijfeeuwenmigratie](#)" focused on Polish Migrants to the Netherlands. Representatives from different Polish organisations, such as the **Edith Stein Museum** and the **Museum Gross Rosen** were invited to the round table to share with international colleagues their experiences. ### EUROCLIO/GAHE active in Tbilisi 12-16 April 19, 2011

As a part of the EUROCLIO/Matra project ‘Tolerance Building Through History Education in Georgia’ 2008-2011, the EUROCLIO and GAHE project management teams convened in Tbilisi to discuss, plan and prepare for the vital concluding stages of the 3 year project. Amongst a number of internal meeting and planning sessions for the final organization of the publication of the teaching resources developed within the project, the team met with a range of governmental and non-governmental stakeholders to increase the visibility of the initiative within Georgia. Discussions on future support for GAHE as an active civil society organization as well as bi-lingual publications and recognition of GAHE from the ministry were issues put on the table. In the coming period, the project management will look to cement the steps forward taken. Furthermore, the official Launch of the project’s publication “How Did We Live Together in Georgia in the 20th Century?” is envisaged for early September in Tbilisi, where a range of stakeholders will be invited to discover this unique educational resource and discuss its added-value for history education in Georgia. Combined, will be training sessions for a core group of around 50 educators to be able to use this publication at school and train colleagues to use it. ### Georgian Ministry of Education Publishes EUROCLIO/GAHE roundtable results

EUROCLIO is glad to announce that the **results of a Roundtable of the Georgian Ministry of Education’s Teacher Professional Development Centre have been published.** The topics of the debate were bi-lingual learning in Georgian minority schools and intercultural dialogue in teaching and history teaching. **Mrs. Nana Tsikhistavi** (President of GAHE), **Lika Medzmariasvhili** (Project Manager GAHE), **Mr. Amiran Jamagadze**, who is a Head of Public School #1 in Tbilisi and **Mrs. Manana Shekiladze**, a History Teacher from the European School in Tbilisi discussed essential issues related to the improvement and innovation of history education in Georgia with Ministry officials and other governmental and non-governmental stakeholders. **Patrick Barker**, present project manager from the EUROCLIO/Matra project, with colleagues from GAHE also pushed for a greater acknowledgement of the training for intercultural competences needed for innovative history education and the importance of bi-lingual education in a country like



Georgia. The event was consequently covered by the Georgian newspaper: “**Georgia Today**” and has now been published within the **Ministry’s quarterly magazine ‘Teacher’** which is disseminated to teachers nationwide. In the course of the MATRA Project, the 6th and final workshop for Coordinators, Authors and Experts took place in the period of January 20th-23rd 2011 in Istanbul, Turkey. ### *Conference on History Education in Lithuania*

On April 1st 2011 the **History Department of The Pedagogical University of Vilnius** and the **International Commission for the Evaluation of the Crimes of the Nazi and Soviet Occupation Regimes in Lithuania** convened a conference in Vilnius entitled: *Teaching the history of the crimes of the Nazi and Soviet occupational regimes: Theory and Practice*. On September 21, 2010 the Sejm (Parliament) of the Republic of Lithuania, proclaimed 2011 a “Year of Memory for those residents of Lithuanians who died and suffered during the Holocaust.” This conference commemorated the events of seventy year ago when, in 1941, the Soviets began a massive deportation of the residents of Lithuania to the Soviet Union. Attendees at the conference included, the ambassador of the United States to Lithuania, Her Excellency **Anne Elizabeth Derse**, Israel’s ambassador to Latvia and Lithuania, His Excellency **Naftali Tamir**, representatives from the foreign ministry of the Republic of Lithuania, along with numerous historians from the USA, Sweden, Lithuania, and approximately one hundred teachers. Participants were familiarized with the latest scholarly research. Additionally, experienced teachers shared their knowledge and skills in teaching this subject to high-school students.

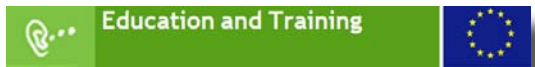
