Projects

History that Connects: a step further thanks to Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

The [Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs](#) decided to **grant a 3-year project to EUROCLIO** to *“adapt, professionalise and empower a regional and innovative approach to the teaching of sensitive history in the countries of Former Yugoslavia so it supports peace and stability in the Western Balkans”*. The *History that Connects Programme*, currently supported by the [Open Society Institute](#), already took off in 2011 with 2 regional workshops in Bosnia and Macedonia. Participants to these events identified sensitive and controversial issues in their common history during the first half of the 20th century, and decided to develop national case studies to be used as teaching resources within the Historiana framework (another EUROCLIO programme). The funding from the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs will have a decisive impact on the implementation of the project, allowing to reach out to a wider group of history educators in the Former Yugoslavia countries, and to develop a variety of teaching resources on the history of the region.

Riga,Latvia: One more inspiring Historiana Seminar



Participants from more than 20 countries convened in Riga, Latvia for three days to discuss new approaches to History Education within the EUROCLIO Historiana Seminar. Two very inspiring talks of **Joke van der Leeuw-Roord**, EUROCLIO Executive Director, and **Sandra Kalniete**, Latvian Member of the European Parliament opened the Seminar. Interactive and practical workshops on the development, usage and assessment of multiperspectivity and inclusiveness as significant parameters in educational materials took

place led by **Dr. Robert Stradling, Dr. Ineke Veldhuis-Meester, Ruth Fisher, Mire Mladenovski and Chris Rowe**. Furthermore, Dr. Robert Stradling and Steven Stegers challenged the participants to explore and discuss the way in which ICT and online educational tools can supplement existing curricula. Much attention was given to the development of the website that will host the materials developed within *"Exploring European History and Heritage"*. The first version of this online educational platform, *Historiana.eu*, will be ready for piloting in the coming months. The seminar received positive feedback from all the participants and was a major step forward in the development of the project "Exploring European History and Heritage" and the realisation of *Historiana.eu*. As our Editor in Chief noted: *"I left Riga feeling energised and very optimistic about the next stage in the development of our project."* **We hope to continue this positive spirit during our next seminar in Fehérvárcsurgó, Hungary from October 27th until October 30th 2011.**

Ankara, Turkey: A Manifold of Actions for Management and Network



Between the days of 26th of June and the 1st of July, EUROCLIO Project Managers Joke van der Leeuw-Roord and Jonathan Even-Zohar met in Ankara with Project Coordinators Dr Semih Aktekin and Dr Mustafa Ozturk for days of intensive high-level meetings,

management updates with the chief-editor Dr Huseyin Koksal and with Academic Advisor and President of the Association of History Educators in Turkey Prof Dr Mustafa Safran. The meetings were held in order to update relevant authorities about the project and association's developments, with a special focus on finding further support for the 19th Annual Professional Training and Development Conference, co-organised by EUROCLIO and the Association of History Educators in Turkey. Moreover, the updates about the editing process has made clear how in fact draft materials are already received very positively at official in-service trainings across Turkey and the editing team is working in a very effective and streamlined manner.

Former Yugoslavia: From Sensitive to Sensible History; Full Report available

PROJECTS

From 22nd till 26th of June 2011 the second Regional Work Session in the EUROCLIO Project "History that Connects. How to teach sensitive and controversial history in the countries of Former Yugoslavia" took place in Veles, Republic of

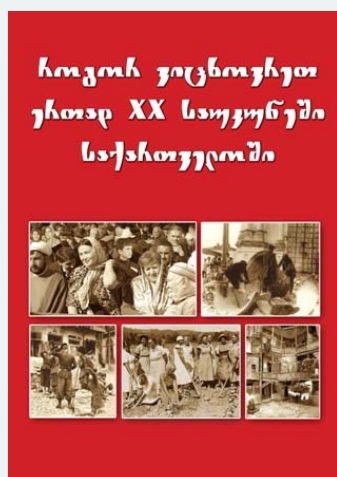


Macedonia. History Teachers Associations from Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Montenegro, Republic of Macedonia, Serbia and Slovenia participated actively. They were joined by observers, representing the Associations in Albania, Bulgaria, Greece, Switzerland and Turkey. Dr Cecyl Esau (Institute of Justice and Reconciliation, Cape Town, South Africa) presented how reconciliation through oral history investigations is helping South Africa move on as a "rainbow nation". This was extremely relevant as it gave way to an open and honest debate about the role of recent conflict, memories of revenge and victimhood in people, which is an element in addressing sensitive and controversial issues in societies.

On the second day, new draft teaching modules were presented and peer-reviewed, all had a focus on the period 1900-1945 and built on the draft timeline and ideas from the first seminar in Sarajevo. Finally, using different discussion groups a reflection and consultation process took place, which led to a common understanding of the results, challenges and next steps for the project. In general, the meeting was very successful in reaching the aims, as well as it provided the capacity to continue the cross-border grassroots civic engagement and networking for history education.

Georgia: Final Publication of the EUROCLIO Project



Under the title "*How did we live together in Georgia in the 20th century?*", a **unique collection of 30 modules** ready for the classroom will be published in Georgian in 2000 copies at the end of July, and will be disseminated after the summer among the Georgian Association of History Educators members and beyond. This publication is the result of a 3-year-long process of capacity-building, knowledge exchange on the national and international level, and collaborative thinking among history educators in Georgia. It

aims to contribute to multicultural education and innovative learning in the country, as complementary resources for history, geography and civics lessons especially between 9th and 11th grade. A wide audience will be invited to discover the publication and hear more about the results of the project on September 1st in Tbilisi Public School #1, where the Deputy Minister of Education of Georgia and the EUROCLIO President Vassiliki Sakka will be present. This event will be followed by a two-day training on the use of the publication in the classroom, and by the Georgian Association of History Educators General Assembly 2011.

Marina Erokhina, active EUROCLIO Member from Russia passed away

"Marina Erokhina, History teacher and Teacher trainer,



died in her home town of Pskov, June 28 2011. Her death seems incredibly unfair to everybody who knew her, not only because she had to fight against illness and suffer for several years, and because she had a wonderful family, and her daughter and husband will miss her awfully.

She was also a person who educated a whole generation of History teachers in the Pedagogical Institute of Pskov, Russia. We know how many of them were grateful for her lectures and workshops and felt that she had really helped them to become teachers. She was also extremely active in two Euroclio Projects in Russia – "Uroki Clio" and the "Mosaics of Culture", and her contribution as author, editor and participant in training seminars was really valuable. Marina fought courageously against her illness. While already having a hard anti-cancer treatment she managed to write several textbooks and tried to work almost to the end. Despite her suffering she remained optimistic and rarely showed her despair. Many people in different towns and countries will remember Marina and grieve over this loss." The Italian association **LANDIS**, National Laboratory for History Teaching (Laboratorio

This conference entitled "A Reflection about Citizenship and Democracy: a Knotty Problem of the Seventies. Italy in the International Context" (*Una riflessione su cittadinanza e democrazia: il nodo degli anni Settanta. Vienna, Austria: Second Project Expert Meeting



The second expert meeting of the project *"Assessment, tutorial structures and initial teacher education of trainee students in the subjects Political/Civic Education, Social/Cultural Studies and History in Europe – a comparative study"*, funded by

the European Union and ERSTE Foundation, took place in Vienna from 25th to 28th May 2011. **40 project members from over 30 countries in Europe**, but also our partners from Euroclio, the Council of Europe and the Georg-Eckert-institute for International Schoolbook Research took part in the meeting. The aims of the meeting were to discuss the interim results of the project's questionnaire, which all participants complete to give evidence based information about the situation in their country with regard to the structures, concepts and standards of assessment, tutorial systems and initial education for teachers of the subjects teaching history and citizenship education. Additionally the result's of the thematic working groups within the project were presented and the work plan for the next year of the project was designed. The next and final meeting of the project is going to take place from 30th May to 2nd June 2012. It is going to concentrate on the dissemination of the final result's of the project. Brussels, Belgium: EUCIS-LLL Steering Committee meeting



On July 2011 the EUCIS LLL Steering Committee, including EUROCLIO Executive Director **Joke van der Leeuw-Roord**, were meeting to discuss the latest EU developments related to Life Long Learning and actions for the rest of 2011, along the 5 priorities of the Organisation. The day before the European Commission had published its proposal to raise the

budget allocated to Education and Culture by 68%. All present programmes will be merged into one Education Europe. The Steering Committee was delighted with the proposed increase however would have preferred the heading Lifelong Learning as such concept is far more inclusive covering, formal, non-formal and informal learning and training. The Committee is developing a strategy for the promotion for the proposed Life Long Learning Institute and prepared meetings with **Ms Doris Pack**, President of CULT Committee of the EU Parliament, and representatives of the 2012 Danish and Cypriot Presidencies. In the afternoon the Committee met with **Mr José Pessanha** and a colleague from DG EAC to discuss the agenda of the Stakeholders' Forum taking place on 26-27 September in Brussels. The next meeting of the Committee will be on 8 November in Brussels

The European Commission proposes to raise the budget education, training and youth



EU Budget: EUCIS-LLL welcomes the Commission's proposal to raise the budget allocated to education, training and youth but uncertainties remain on the content of the future "Education programme"

Brussels, 4th July 2011 // On 29th June, the European Commission published its proposal on the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF). The European Civil Society Platform on Lifelong Learning (EUCIS-LLL) welcomes the proposal to raise the budget allocated to Education and Culture by 68% (from 9,1 billion EUR to 15,2 billion EUR) for the period 2014–2020. EUCIS-LLL feels this proposal matches the high objectives of the Europe 2020 strategy. However, it is concerned about the decision to merge education, training and youth programmes into a so-called "Education Europe" programme.
