From Channel 4 News: A Twitter account is reporting the events of World War II as it happened, minute by minute, for the next six years.

The [Twitter](#) account [@RealTimeWWII](#) is tweeting the events of [World War II](#) over the next 6 years as and when it happened in real time, 72 years ago.

The brain child of 24-year-old Alwyn Collinson, [@RealTimeWWII](#) has accumulated a staggering 73,000-plus followers and is being translated into Russian, Portuguese and Spanish.

"It's to give that feeling of 'this might be happening right now, to me'," Mr Collinson told **Channel 4 News**. "It's about us avoiding the trap of hindsight, because at the time, it wasn't like that and there was incredible fear and uncertainty.

"It's easy to forget that, because we know what's going to happen - that the good guys win."

## New Book: "History Wars and the Classroom: Global Perspectives"

EUROCLIO Vice-President Sylvia Semmet wrote an article in the new very recommendable publication on the field EUROCLIO is working in. The book is entitled *History Wars and the Classroom: Global Perspectives* and examines how ten separate countries have experienced debates and disputes over the contested nature of the subject, for example the 'Black Armband' and 'Whitewash' factions in Australia who adopt opposingly celebratory or denigratory views of Australian history, especially when evaluating episodes of poor racial relations. There are also tensions between traditional/patriotic views of history teaching and reformed or 'new' history. There are issues of political control of the curriculum and parallel issues of who writes it (very topical in England at the moment over two expat 'big picture' historians who work at Harvard and Columbia (Niall Ferguson and Simon Schama)).

## OSCE publishes "Guidelines for Educators on Countering Intolerance and Discrimination against Muslims"

EUROCLIO partner, the **Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE)** has recently published "*Guidelines for Educators on Countering Intolerance and Discrimination against Muslims: Addressing Islamophobia through Education*". **Dr. Marat Gibatdinov**, president of the **Tatarstan History Teachers Association** has also made a contribution to this OSCE publication.

As the foreword in of the report itself says, the purpose is: "*Promoting mutual understanding and respect for diversity, along with countering all forms of intolerance and discrimination, must today, more than ever, be absolute priorities for the international community, in order to maintain peace and stability at both the global and regional levels. The attitudes and tensions that lead to inter-communal conflict are often deeply rooted in stereotypes and misconceptions, and one of the most pressing contemporary challenges is to promote knowledge about, and understanding of, different cultures. Educators play a fundamental role in meeting this challenge.*"

## New: UN Declaration on Human Rights Education and Training

The Human Rights Education Associates (HREA) announces:

On 19th of December 2011 "The United Nations General Assembly in New York adopted the Declaration on Human Rights Education and Training. This landmark document recognises the right of every one of the planet's seven billion people to have access to human rights education, a lifelong process involving all ages, all parts of society, and every kind of education, formal and informal.


The Declaration specifies not simply what one should learn about human rights, but also how ("through human rights, which includes learning and teaching in a way that respects the rights of both educators and learners") and also why ("for human rights, which includes empowering persons to enjoy and exercise their rights and to respect and uphold the rights of others").

The adoption of this new Declaration also offers educators and policy makers an occasion to reassess national policies and priorities in the light of international standards. If as the Declaration states, "human rights education and training is essential for the promotion of universal respect for and observance of all human rights and fundamental freedoms for all," then human rights education is not only the entitlement of every human being, but also a

necessity for responsible global citizenship."

## Doctoral grant for Board Member Marjan de Groot-Reuvekamp

The official handover of the doctoral grant on 21 December by Halbe Zijlstra, Secretary of State for Education. 

Board Member Marjan de Groot-Reuvekamp was one of 36 teachers who received a doctoral grant, that allows her to do research for a period of four years on a 0.4 fte basis. The theme of her study is "Improving the understanding of historical time of students aged 6 to 12 years".

The study focuses on the comparison of the English and Dutch curriculum for history in primary education, more specific for student's understanding of historical time. The results will be used for the development of a didactical approach to improve students' understanding of historical time. A quasi-experimental design is used in the grades 3,4 and 6,7 to measure effects of the approach. The study will result in recommendations for primary education and teacher training.

## Projects

### History Teachers meet for Capacity Building and Curriculum Assessment in Republic of Macedonia




The First Capacity Building and Curriculum Workshop within the EUROCLIO/OSI/UNAOC Programme "*History that Connects - How to teach sensitive Topics in Macedonia*" was held recently in **Ohrid, Macedonia, 15 – 18 January 2012**. Representatives from all **Former Yugoslavia**, as well as contributors

from **Finland** and **Estonia** were actively engaged

during the workshop. In total 39 history educators participated, mainly from the Western part of the Republic of Macedonia. The workshop organized by the [History Teachers Association of Macedonia \(HTAM\)](#), and enabled the participants to develop the organizational and networking capacity of the Association of History Educators in Macedonia(AHEM).

Many topics were discussed, using creative World Café Methods, including curriculum design and development, textbook production and the systems of in-service and pre-service teacher training. Through this seminar, the outlines of the research on the development of History Education in the country became clear. Furthermore, the Workshop was a good opportunity to network, build the capacity of the Albanian, Bosnian, Croatian, Kosovar, Macedonian, Montenegrin, Serbian and Slovenian History Teachers Associations, as well as the overall regional capacity and the capacity of individual professionals and to present the current state of history education issues of the countries of Former Yugoslavia. A full report will be issued soon.

### Pula, Croatia: Progressing the Regional Programme: Fourth Regional Seminar

The Fourth Regional Seminar within the EUROCLIO/OSI/UNAOC Programme "*History that Connects. How to teach sensitive and controversial issues in the countries of Former Yugoslavia*" will be held in **Pula, Croatia on 1<sup>st</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> March 2012**. 

Representatives from all **Former Yugoslavia**, as well as contributors from **Israel** and **Italy** will actively engage during the seminar. The seminar is co-organised with the [History Teachers Association of Croatia](#), and will focus on further development of Educational Material. This includes; identification of topics for seven new modules on selected sensitive and controversial history of 1900-1945, implementing regional relevance and collecting regional sources, which enables more multiperspectivity. The material will be focussing on active learning methods based on the EUROCLIO and Historiana Framework, and the programme will include a workshop about **Recommendation on the Teaching of Sensitive and Controversial Issues**. Furthermore, the Regional Seminar will be a good opportunity to network, to build the capacity of the Bosnian, Croatian, Kosovar, Macedonian, Montenegrin, Serbian and Slovenian History Teachers Associations, as well as the overall regional capacity and the capacity of individual professionals and to present the current state of history education issues of the countries of Former Yugoslavia. ## In-Service Teacher Trainers from all over Turkey attend Teacher Training Conference, 19-23 January 2012



As the **EUROCLIO/Matra** Project *A Key to Europe - Innovative Methodology for Turkish School History* is in the final stages, an important milestone was achieved in January. In close cooperation with the Ministry of Education's Board of Education a Teacher Training Conference was organised, that invited the officially appointed *Formateur Teachers* for all regions in Turkey to get acquainted with the newly published teacher resource book *Innovative History Teaching – Exemplar Lessons* (see below). History Teachers, Curriculum Advisers and Teacher Trainers took part in this conference. International workshops were given by **Neil McLennan** (United Kingdom, President of **SATH**- Scottish Association of Teachers of History) and **Dr. Katherine Burn** (**London University**, Institute of Education, United Kingdom) **EUROCLIO** Management at the event in **Kizilcahamam**, were amazed at the constant stream of positive remarks about the project's ideas, implementation and all were very eager to take the material back to their regions and disseminate it further. ## New EUROCLIO Teacher Resource Book for Turkey: Innovative History Teaching – Exemplar Lessons

One year after the large process of authoring of teaching material, peer-review and further development, the Editors in the EUROCLIO/Matra Project *A Key to Europe – Innovative Methodology for Turkish School History* – have finalised their work. The result is the latest **EUROCLIO Teacher Resource**, entitled *Innovative History Teaching – Exemplar Lessons*, which includes 34 lessons. All lessons are connected to different curriculum topics, as well learning outcomes. They are categorised in four categories: (1) Multiperspectivity, (2) Controversial Issues, (3) Critical Thinking and (4) Creative Thinking. In addition, all topics have as well a strong element of making history be the history of ordinary people's every-day lives. These 34 lesson modules are all based on referenced sources as evidence, and work towards a deeper students understanding of multiperspectivity.



**Chief-Editor Huseyin Koksal** recently told an audience of teacher trainers, that *"generally history teaching in turkey is teacher-centered, and the official textbooks are holy. We don't allow them to lengthen their sources, it is a protective method. (...) New course books, new examination standards, new teacher training courses are implemented by the Ministry of National Education and many new projects started. This project, however, is the biggest and most important one. This is the most innovative project that the history education community has ever had. We now get rid of fake documents, fake ideas, and fake statistics. They were only there to develop concrete and blocked minds."*

The book will soon be available for download free of charge.

## New Project 'Mediterranean Dialogues' puts forward cooperation with the Middle East and North Africa

The **Open Society Institute** has granted **EUROCLIO** a project 'Mediterranean Dialogues' within the **Education Support**



**Programme** as a first step towards more intensive cooperation

with history-, heritage- and citizenship educators in **North Africa** and the **Middle East**.

The project will enable at least 15 educators from this region to participate in the EUROCLIO conference 'Looking at History through a Variety of Lenses' that will take place in **Antalya** from **1-7 April 2012**. The project also enables to organisation of a special event

'Responsible and Innovative History Education in North Africa and the Middle East' and the publication of a **Special Report** to take stock of current research and initiatives and identify ways ahead for cooperation in this region.

## LIMA: Commemoration of "Freedom Defenders Day", Lithuania

### MEMBERS

On the **13th of January** almost all schools, different institutions and enterprises participated in the traditional civil initiative "*The Memory is live because it proclaims*" initiated by The International Commission for the Evaluation of the Crimes of the Nazi and Soviet Occupation Regimes in Lithuania. On the 13th January the **Freedom Defenders Day** at eight o'clock in the morning the memory candles were lighted in the windows for ten minutes to let people feel the consolidation of Lithuanian nation that was especially strong on the day of 13th January, 1991. The flames reminded the tragic days when the Lithuanian society was united by strong values and ideas that helped to resist against the aggression of soviet invaders and local collaborators.

**History teachers association of Lithuania** supported this initiative and invited all teachers and students to support this idea. In 2012 this initiative was joined by **903 schools** and **113 different institutions** in Lithuania and abroad.

## New Publications from Israeli NGO Emek Shaveh

The Emek Shaveh, an Israeli NGO consisting of archaeologists and human rights activists working to change the role of archaeology in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, inform us about their two recent publications: **"Between Holiness and Propaganda: Archaeology and Political Claims over the Old City of Jerusalem"** (December 2011) aims to raise public awareness about how archaeological research influences the identity and the character of the Old City. In the publication, Emek Shaveh also provide suggestions for how the archaeological finds could be presented as telling a complex story independent of religious or nationalist dictates. It is their belief that by listening to this multicultural story we can enrich culture and promote values of tolerance and pluralism. The publication can be read on their [website](#).



Emek Shaveh published their own Guide Book **"From Shiloah to Silwan"** of the City of David archaeological site. The guide book is the first attempt to explain the archaeological finds as a way to learn about past cultures, next to learning about today's community and the political impact of the archaeological sites on the conflict. It gives the visitor the tools for an independent appreciation of the variety of cultures and eras represented at the site, with an emphasis on everyday life. ## Anne Frank Project developing their third graphic novel: 'Friendship'

The [Anne Frank House](#), a valued EUROCLIO partner, is more than a museum. In the past they published for instance two graphic novels: one about *the Holocaust* and one about *The Family Secret*. The graphic about the Holocaust tells the story of Esther, a Jewish girl, that survived the Second World War, but her parents do not. Esther goes in search of what exactly happened to her parents. The other graphic tells the gripping story of the Van Dort family in wartime. Both graphics are meant for young people from **12 to 15 years old** ([click here](#) for more information).

There is a **third graphic to be added in the future**, meant for the same age. '*Friendship*' is the name, **a comic about young people in today's society**. It shows how social mechanisms operate, including stereotyping, prejudice and discrimination. The way you see others is connected to your own self-esteem, and is linked to questions of identity and the formation of groups. The consequences of bullying, prejudice, and discrimination need to be made clear to show that excluding people isn't acceptable.

During two days (12 and 13 January) a team of international experts gave advice about the scenario and the synopsis of the graphic novel. It will take around 1-2 years to finish it. **Huub Kurstjens** (*the Netherlands*) represented EUROCLIO. There was also time to show what EUROCLIO stands for and what kind of the project '*Historiana*' is.
